YOU MAY VOTE NOW

By going to the Registrar of Voters - 808 No. Spring St. Be certain to sign statement that you will not and have not used an absentee ballot.

SUGGESTION: To all Assembly Clubs who have gathering places

CONTACT: Canteens, U.S.O. Hdqts., Management of Bus and Train Terminals ---

Request permission to post the above information on cards or placards -- THIS IS NON-PARTISAN. Present your request on this basis.

2. UNION COORDINATORS: Get names of MIGRANT WORKERS who have just come into your jurisdiction. Help them get Absentee Ballots from their Home States.

SUGGESTION: Have Shop Stewards post notices instructing out of State Members how to apply for Absentee Ballots.

3. SOUND TRUCKS: Private cars can be rigged up as Sound Trucks by carrying Portable Victrola. These are effective on Election Day. Get records from Radio Com. - H.D.C. - HO-6325.

TO AREAS WHERE CANDIDATES HAVE WON--OR WILL HAVE LITTLE DIFFICULTY IN WINNING ----Such as 12th C.D. - Jerry Voorhis --- 17th C.D. Cecil King--- 19th C.D., Chet Holifield

The more votes gotten from such areas -- the greater will our majority be state-wide. These may very well be the sections to carry the state.

(SUGGESTED INSTRUCTIONS USED IN 60 A.D.)

ATTENTION: SECTION LEADERS AND PRECINCT CAPTAINS! IMPORTANT!

We have invested heavily in time, money, and shoe leather in order to get every voter registered. LET'S GET THEM TO THE POLLS!

This can only be done by concentrated work in every precinct. Begin in the precincts where we do have precinct captains. Tighten up those areas and get more people in those precincts than you can use. We need them for shock troops to organize listless areas.

This can best be done by contacting every democrat in the precinct. Sign them up for telephone jobs, ask them to come to a precinct meeting, and put them to work now. They will then have had experience by election day. They can do telephoning on meetings, on candidates qualifications (from mimeographed telephone conversations) or on asking for workers.

In order to do this you must have several duplicate voter lists -- by street. Making those duplicates is a job for a new worker. Give those duplicates to at least three different people in a precinct. Let them get you a telephone worker on every street.

ON ELECTION DAY we must have housewives for day work. Two people should check the polls at 3 PM. They should copy down the names of persons who have not voted -- go home and give those names by street to the telephoner on that street. This person in turn checks by phone with the people who have phones and goes to the houses of those without homes on her street, or gets someone to go for her. If both residents of any house work days, leave a note--and a very stiff one--telling them to vote as soon as they get home.

All precincts who have one or two women to spare - with cars - sign up in advance with your section leader to work in another section--if possible a section previously worked in.

Remember that election boards CHALLENGE VOTERS and voters timidly withdraw. Voters should vote anyway and let the vote be challenged afterwards. Section leaders should know the reputation of various election boards and know which ones need poll watchers--during the day to keep votes from being challenged, and during the counting. They should be present to the very end when the votes are totalled. Schedule this work - so many hours per person--and this would be an excellent job for Big Democrats who have not had to do a lot of hard tedious precinct work! Getting poll watchers who stick to the job is the most difficult task of all! It is a tough job and should not fall on tired, weary precinct workers. Open houses at the Candidates should be on the next night - or in relays - spelling off the watchers.

By CHECKING ELECTION BOARDS you will find some that are all Republicans or phony Democrats--call the inspector and find out who is on the board--check it against the precinct lists and check back over the precinct vote for the primaries--you will spot suspicious places--keep your eye on Republican majority in what should be Democratic precincts. Either the democrats didn't vote, a mistake in the count, or too many timid people were challenged.
